The Buraq was long and white, smaller than a mule but bigger than a donkey. With each step, it leapt as far as the eye could see. It moved faster than a flash of lightning!

The journey from al-Masjid al-Aqsa to the seven Heavens is called al-Mi'raj. ★

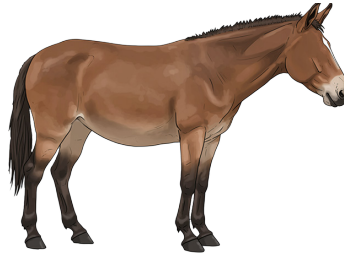


The next morning, the Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم was back in Makkah. This whole amazing journey happened within one night!

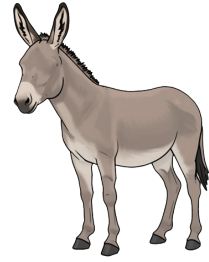
