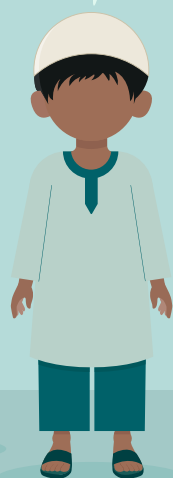
Allah has a great plan for all of His creation and He is always in control of everything. This includes all the good things, and the things that appear to be bad.

Sometimes we think something is bad for us, but Allah always knows better!

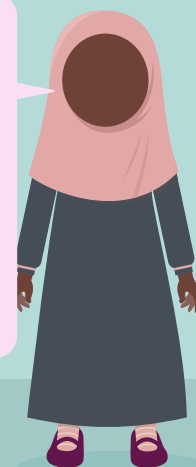
Sometimes we don't like the taste of medicine, but we drink it because we know it is good for us.



Yuk! I hate that brown medicine Mum gives us when we're ill.



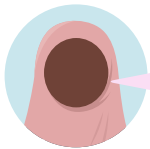
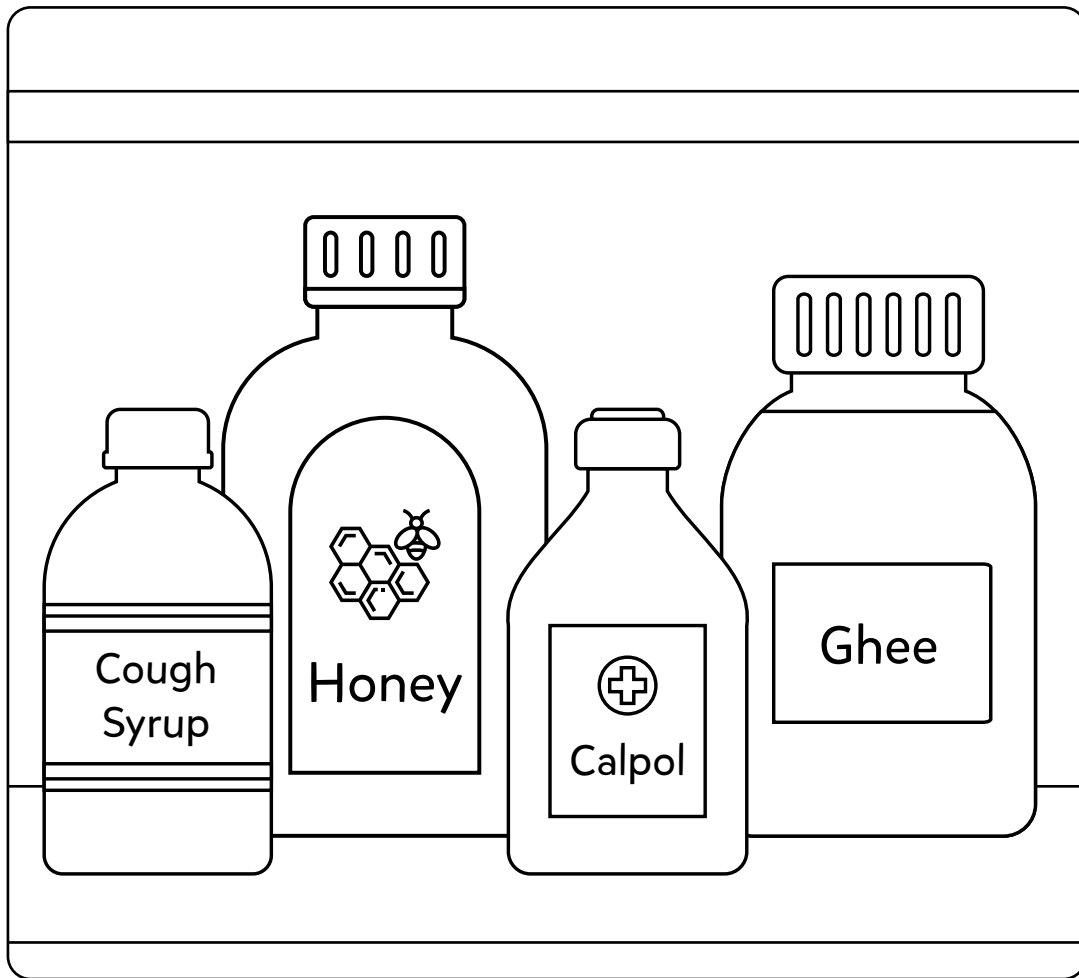
I know! It tastes nasty. But she only gives it to us because she loves us and it is good for us.
