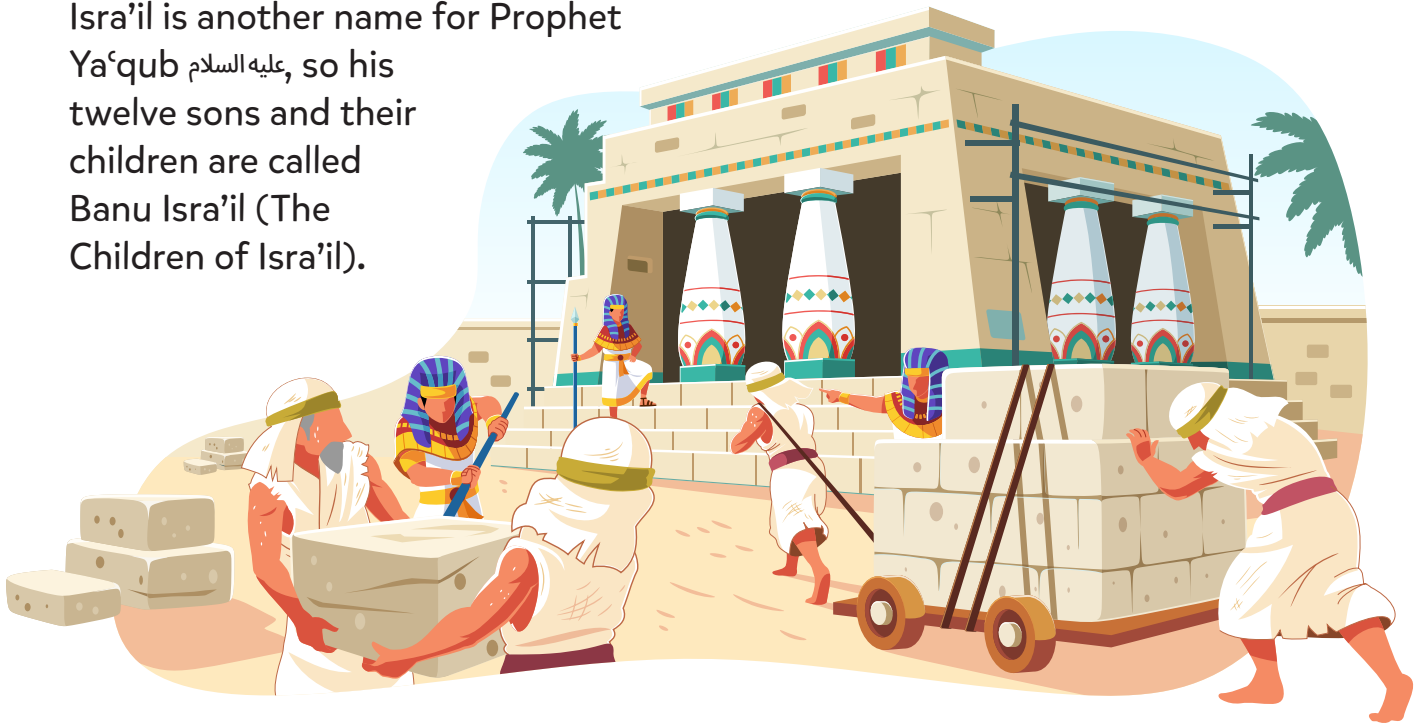


Lesson 5

Baby Musa عليه السلام

Many years after Yusuf عليه السلام, Egypt was ruled by a very nasty and very proud Fir'awn (Pharaoh). He was especially cruel to Banu Isra'il and forced them to work day and night.

Isra'il is another name for Prophet Ya'qub عليه السلام, so his twelve sons and their children are called Banu Isra'il (The Children of Isra'il).



One night, Fir'awn had a frightening dream that a baby boy from Banu Isra'il would grow up and take his kingdom. He ordered his soldiers to kill all their newborn boys!



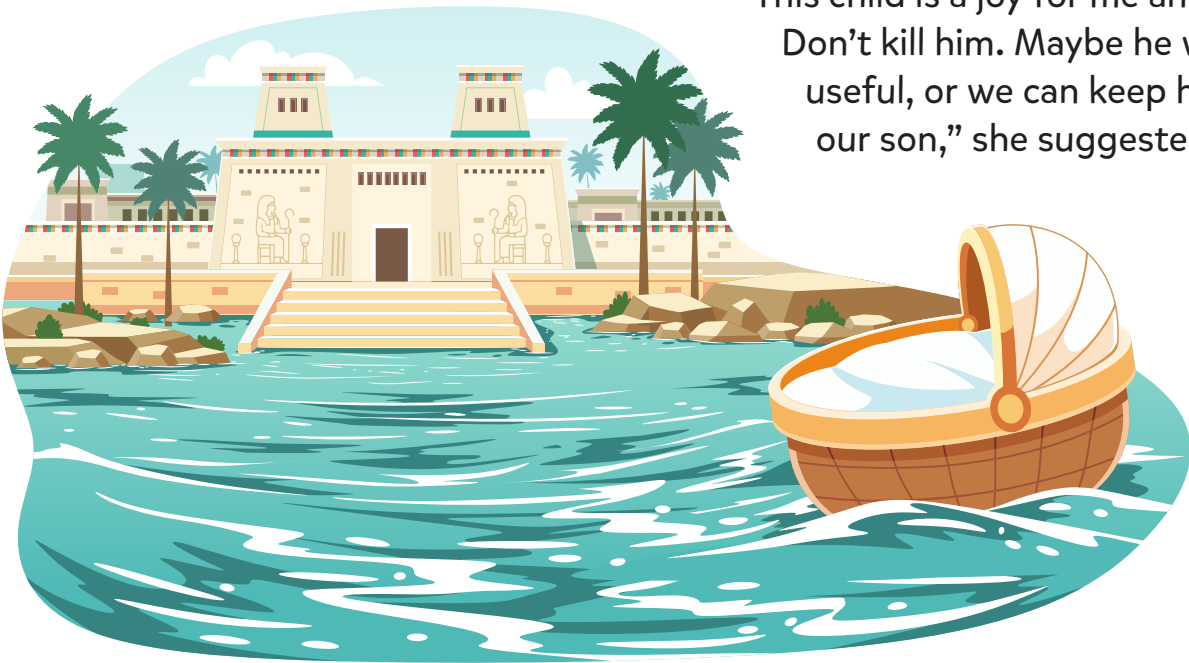
Around this time, baby Musa was born. His mother held him tightly, her heart full of worry and fear. Then Allah inspired her, "Put him into a basket and place it in the river. Don't be scared or worried. We will return him to you and make him a Messenger of Allah."

Musa's sister watched carefully from a distance.

The basket floated gently along the river until it reached Fir'awn's palace. Fir'awn wanted to get rid of baby Musa, but his wife adored him.

Baby Musa wouldn't drink milk from any of the women at the palace, so they searched for a suitable woman at the marketplace. Musa's sister stepped forward and offered, "Shall I show you a family who could care for him?"

She led them home... back to his own mother! Musa settled happily and drank milk from her. Allah returned him safely, just as He had promised!

Like the mother of Musa عليه السلام, I will always trust Allah سبحانه و تعالى.



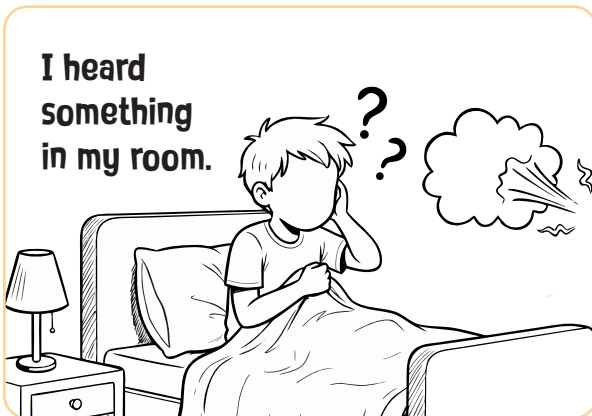

Lesson 6

Musa عليه السلام Escapes Egypt

Musa عليه السلام grew up in Fir'awn's palace. He lived with wealth and power, but he cared deeply about Banu Isra'il.



One day, he saw two men fighting: one from Banu Isra'il and one from Fir'awn's people. The Isra'ili man cried for help. Trying to protect him, Musa عليه السلام punched the other man. The man fell and died!

Musa عليه السلام felt very upset. He knew this was from Shaytan. He prayed, "My Lord, I have done wrong. Forgive me."

The next morning, the same man cried for help again. When Musa عليه السلام went towards him, he became afraid and shouted, "Are you going to kill me like you killed that man yesterday?"

The secret was out!

Fir'awn was furious and sent his men to catch Musa عليه السلام.

A man ran through the city to warn him, "O Musa! They want to kill you. Leave the city."

Fearfully, Musa عليه السلام fled from Egypt and prayed, "My Lord, save me from the wrongdoers."



Musa عليه السلام ran until he reached the land of Madyan. There, he saw men watering their animals at a well. Nearby, two young women were waiting. Musa عليه السلام helped water their animals. Then he rested in the shade and made du'a, "My Lord, I need any good You send to me."



After a while, one of the women returned and told Musa عليه السلام that her elderly father wanted to meet him.

Once there, Musa عليه السلام explained why he had left Egypt. The old man comforted him, "Do not be afraid. You have escaped the wrongdoers."

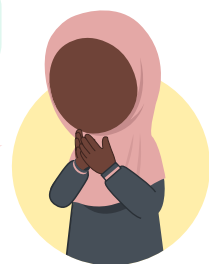
He then said, "I'd like you to marry one of my daughters if you work for me for eight or ten years."

How to Throw a Punch



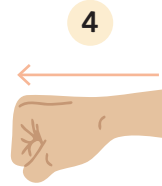
Get ready

Clench your fists



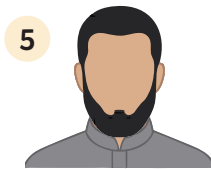
Raise your fists to your face

Lesson 7

Musa and Harun عليهما السلام Visit Fir'awn

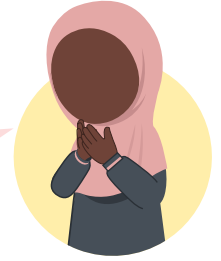
Musa عليه السلام felt a tightness in his chest. Allah had ordered him to speak to the nasty, powerful Fir'awn. He was nervous.

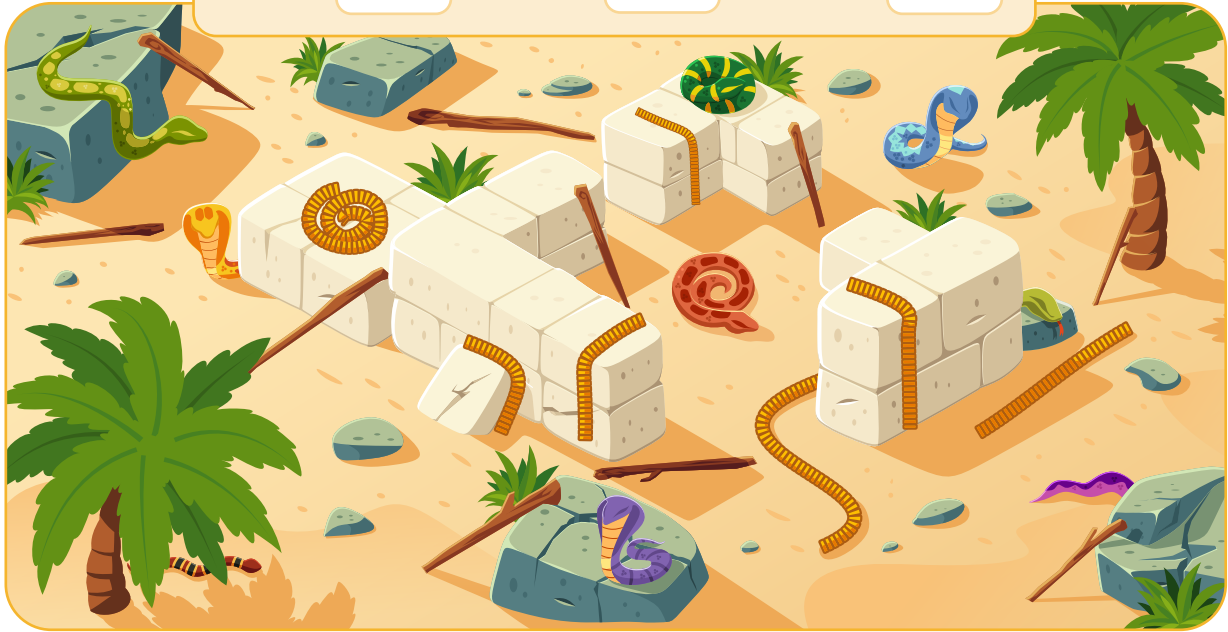


Magic is false and weak. Allah is The Most Powerful!

Fir’awn, who claimed to be god, could not even save himself!

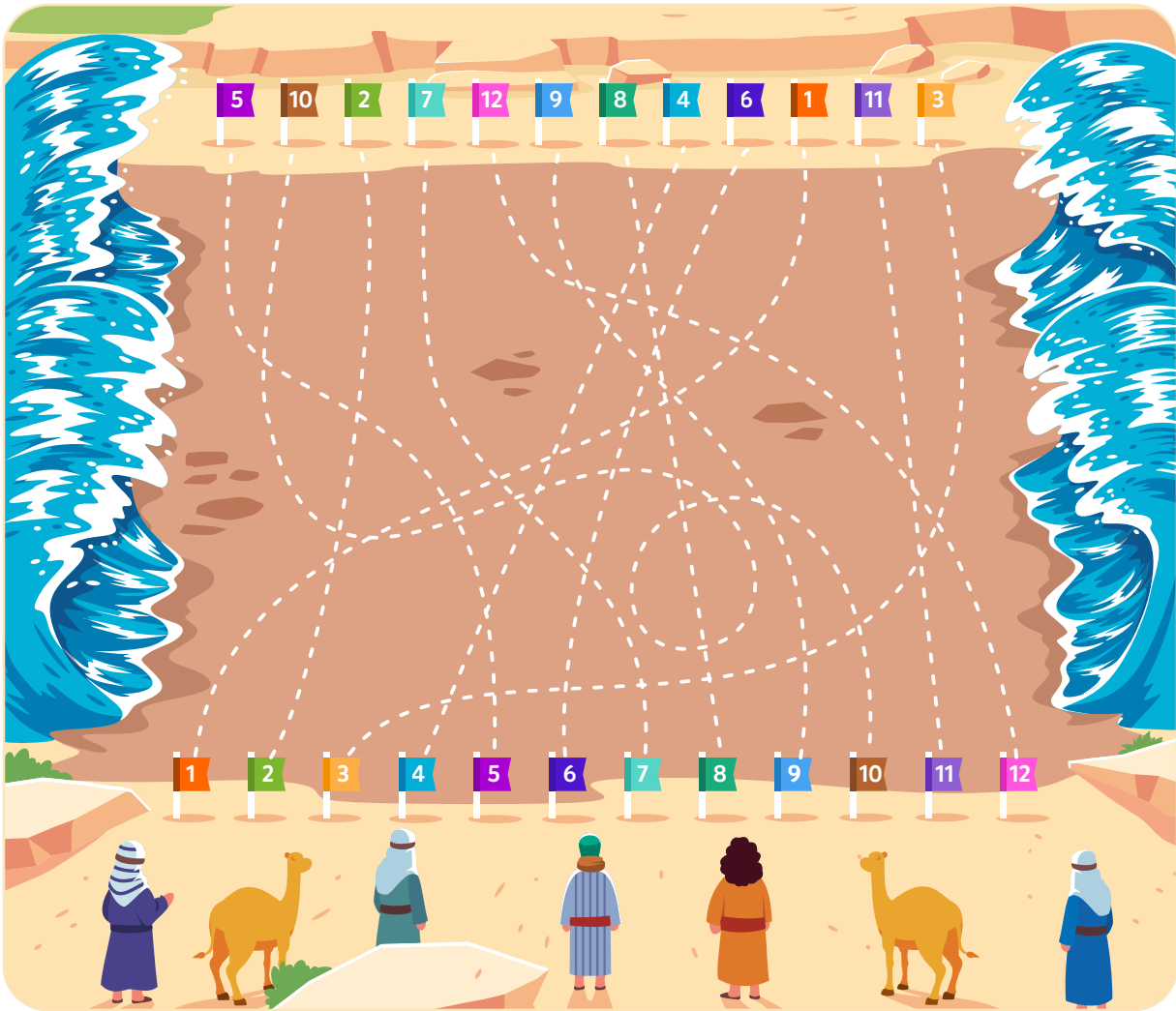
