One night, the people of Madinah woke up, startled by a large bang. They felt very scared, thinking they were being attacked by enemies. Some of the Companions came out of their houses and started to walk towards where the noise came from.

To their surprise, they found the Messenger من الله عليه وسلم returning on a horse. He had already beaten them to it! The horse belonged to a Companion called Abu Talhah رضي الله عليه وسلم. The Messenger صلى الله عليه وسلم was riding it without a saddle.

He had a sword around his neck and he began to comfort the people, "Don't be scared! Don't be scared!" It was just a false alarm! There was nothing to be afraid of.

He then said "I found it (the horse) to be superfast!" Before this incident, Abu Talhah's horse had been really slow, but due to the blessing of Allah's Messenger صلى الله عليه وسلم, it became very fast.

Saddle: a seat fastened on the back of a horse or other animal, where a rider sits.

Riding a horse without a saddle is uncomfortable. He صلى الله عليه وسلم gave up his own comfort to help others.
