IT'S STORY TIME! Khabbab: The Steadfast Swordsmith

In the bustling city of Makkah, Umm Anmar wandered through the market looking to buy a slave. Her eyes landed on a young boy whose seller was shouting: "Who wants to buy this boy? His bones are very strong and he is very healthy!" Umm Anmar purchased him immediately.

The boy's name was **Khabbab**. Umm Anmar noticed there was something special about this boy - not only was he strong, he was intelligent too. She trained him to become a swordsmith so he could become a master at making sharp shiny swords. Before long, he became famous throughout Makkah for his brilliant skills and his honesty.

Something serious was stirring in Makkah at this time. There were whispers of a new Prophet who had been sent by Allah. Khabbab was intrigued - he wanted to hear things for himself. So he went to meet the Prophet. He was so inspired by the teachings of the Prophet ملى الله عليه وسلم that he immediately accepted Islam - he was one of the first 10 people to do so.
