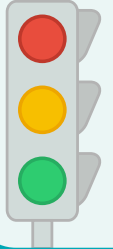

The Crushing Fire

	الْحُطْمَةُ	فِي	لَيُنْبَذَنَّ	كَلَّا
(4)	the crushing Fire	in	he will certainly be thrown	never
Never! He will certainly be thrown into the crushing Fire. (4)				

This person thinks their wealth will make them live forever, but that's not true.

The word كَلَّا means 'never!' or 'certainly not!' It is a word used to strongly reject and deny something. This means that his wealth will certainly **not** make him live forever. Instead, he will die and be thrown and tossed into الْحُطْمَةُ, like rubbish thrown into a garbage bin.

And what will make you know what the crushing Fire is? (5)				

الْحُطْمَةُ

al-Hutamah is one of the names of Jahannam. The fire will be so intense that it will crush and destroy everything thrown into it.

وَمَا أَذْرَكَ

This question makes you stop and think. It is a phrase which draws your attention to what is about to be said—it is a serious matter! In other words, الْحُطْمَةُ is no ordinary fire; it is a very severe punishment which we should take very seriously.

The Fire That Doesn't Burn Out

	الْمُوقَدَّةُ	اللَّهِ	نَارُ

الْمُوقَدَّةُ

It will be extremely hot with enormous flames. It will have plenty of 'fuel' and will never die out.

نَارُ اللَّهِ

The fire of Jahannam is no ordinary fire—it is a fire created by Allah!

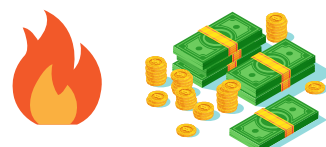
