
Aims & Objectives

9. Develop a love of lifelong learning and a passion to serve the dīn of Allah.
10. Be well-equipped to deal with personal, local and global challenges, and become beacons of justice and mercy for the entire world.

The Qur'an is the eternal book of guidance. It is a light which illuminates the path of truth amidst the darkneses of falsehood. The Qur'an contains legal rulings for a human to live on Allah's earth, as His subservient slaves. It is a book of blessings and eternal wisdom; a warner and a giver of good news. It is a cure for every disease – be it spiritual or physical.

The Qur'an was the manual that the Prophet ﷺ used to raise and nurture the best of generations — a generation characterised by unwavering imān, a deep love for Allah and His Messenger ﷺ and the pursuit of ihsān. The Qur'an transformed their hearts, minds, characters and their entire lives.

This did not happen overnight. In fact, the Qur'an was revealed over a period of 23 years to allow the companions to understand, internalise and shape their character according to it. Abū 'Abd al-Raḥmān al-Sulamī ؓ said: "Those who used to teach us the Qur'an — such as 'Uthmān b. 'Affān and 'Abdullah b. Mas'ūd ؓ etc — told us that when they learned ten verses from the Prophet ﷺ, they would not move on from them until they had learned the knowledge and actions contained within them." They said: **"So we learned the Qur'an, knowledge, and action all together."**

Sometimes, we only focus on making our children memorise the Qur'an or perfect their tajwīd, but we neglect to inspire and teach them the message and the meanings of the Qur'an. Al-Ḥasan al-Baṣrī ؓ said, "Certainly, slaves and children recite the Qur'an and they have no knowledge of its meaning. **They memorised its letters but neglected its commands**, to the extent that one of them will say, "By Allah, I have recited the entire Qur'an without missing out on any letter." By Allah, he has missed out on all of it! **For there is no effect of the Qur'an on his character and actions.** By Allah, it is not about memorising its letters, and then neglecting its commands!"

The number of companions who memorised the Qur'an was not high in number, yet they all lived and breathed the Qur'an. Their primary concern was to put into practice what they had learned. 'Abdullāh b. Mas'ūd ؓ said, "Memorising the words of the Qur'an is difficult for us, but acting upon it is easy for us. As for those who come after us, memorising the Qur'an will be easy for them, but acting upon it will be difficult for them."

Strengthening Iman through the Qur'an

Allah ﷻ says, “Certainly the believers are those whose hearts tremble at the remembrance of Allah, **whose faith increases when His verses are recited to them**, and who put their trust in their Lord” (8:2).

One of the key aims of the Qur'an lessons should be to increase our īmān through it. Jundub b. 'Abdillāh ؓ said, “We were with the Prophet ﷺ and we were young men, nearing puberty. We learnt īmān before we learnt Qur'an. Then we learnt Qur'an, and increased our īmān through it” (Ibn Mājah).

It is vital that before we teach the dos and don'ts of Islam, we instil in our children the knowledge, love, and reverence of Allah ﷻ. Once they know the Command Giver, the commands will become easy to follow. We learn this from the sīrah and the Qur'an itself. During the 13 years in Makkah, the Prophet ﷺ instilled īmān in the hearts of the Companions ؓ; very few legal rulings were revealed and instead the focus was on: (1) The Oneness of Allah (2) Prophethood (3) The Hereafter.

'Ā'ishah ؓ said, “Indeed the first verses to be revealed were from the shorter chapters at the end of the Qur'an which contain the mention of Paradise and Hellfire. **When the people were firmly established upon Islam, the verses of halal and haram were revealed.** If the first verse to be revealed was 'do not drink wine,' they would have said, 'we will never stop drinking wine.' And if the first verse to be revealed was 'do not commit adultery,' they would have said, 'we will never stop committing adultery’” (Bukhārī).

Tadabbur

One of the aims of the Qur'an lessons is that children are ultimately inspired and equipped with the skills over the years to do tadabbur (reflection) of the Qur'an. Tadabbur is the key to knowledge and all sciences. It is the means of attaining closeness to Allah, and the key to tasting the sweetness of recitation and Ṣalāh.



About This Book



The **Qur'an & Tadabbur Level 2** book aims to introduce the Qur'ān in an engaging and accessible way for young learners. It consists of 25 lessons, beginning with the story of the first revelation.

The book **gently introduces key concepts** in a child-friendly manner, including the purpose and nature of the Qur'ān, our responsibilities towards it, and how the Prophet ﷺ and his Companions interacted with it.


It also provides a brief introduction to Sūrah al-Fātiḥah, Sūrah al-Ikhlāṣ, Sūrah al-Falaq, Sūrah al-Nās, and Āyat al-Kursī.

Through **stories** and **enjoyable activities**, the book aims to nurture a **love for the Qur'ān** and build a deep connection with it in young hearts. It has been designed for **Year 2 children (average age 6–7 years)**, but may also be used with older children.

The book can be used **alongside Qur'an recitation and memorisation lessons**. It may be taught as one lesson per week over a single academic year, or spread across two years, to gently nurture children's love for the Qur'ān and help them understand the purpose behind their recitation and memorisation.

Every textbook has its limitations. Textbooks are one of the many tools that can be used to educate our children. What is more important is how the teachings and ideals of the Qur'ān and Sunnah are translated into practice, in our own lives as educators, and in the lives of our young learners. We encourage educators to nurture a Qur'ānic environment within their learning institutions and homes to make this a reality inshāAllah.

How to Use This Book



Learning Objectives

The key aims and outcomes of the lesson are clearly listed at the beginning of the lesson. A traffic light system helps outline the differentiated learning outcomes.

- On your mark! – This is a **beginner** level objective which all learners should be able to access and engage with.
- Get set! – This is an **intermediate** level objective which all learners should be able to take part in, although some students may need extra support.
- Go! – This is the **advanced** or higher-order objective that most learners will be able to engage with to some level, although some learners may need support to express their ideas in writing.

Key Words

The key words will develop student literacy and expand their vocabulary. Educators are encouraged to do spelling tests and play word games with their class once a week/every 2 weeks to assess learning.

Memorise

Learners can memorise short Surahs and verses to help them internalise the teachings of the dīn.

Thinking Starters

Educators are encouraged to write the question on the board before the start of the lesson. As learners walk into the classroom, they should start to think about the question or discuss it with a peer. Learners do not need to write down the answer. It will be used to set the scene for the lesson.

Tasks

There are accompanying tasks in each lesson for reinforcement and practical application. Learners can do these individually, in pairs or in groups. Educators can collect the books to mark the learners' work, or go through the answers orally together as a class.

Why Did Allah Send the Qur'an?

Allah sent down the Qur'an to **guide** us. **Guide** means to show the way. Allah سبحانه و تعالى says that the Qur'an is:

"...A guidance for the obedient people."

(Surah al-Baqarah:2)

The Qur'an shows us the BEST way to live!



Suddenly, his horse began to jump around with fear. Usayd stopped reciting, and the horse became calm.










After Prophet Muhammad صلى الله عليه وسلم passed away, Abu Bakr said to 'Umar رضي الله عنهما: "Let's visit Umm Ayman, just as the Messenger of Allah صلى الله عليه وسلم used to visit her."


IT'S STORY TIME!

The Young Imam

At the time of the Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم, there was a young boy named 'Amr ibn Salimah رضي الله عنه. He and his **tribe** were not Muslim yet. 'Amr's tribe lived in a place where travellers would stop to drink water and rest.

They asked the passing travellers the latest news about Prophet Muhammad صلى الله عليه وسلم: "What is happening? Who is this man?"

A **tribe** is a big group of families who live and work together.



The travellers would say, “He says Allah has sent him!” They would share some verses from the Qur’an with the tribe.

‘Amr loved these beautiful words. He **listened carefully** and **memorised the Qur’an** he heard.

Memorise means to learn by heart.

A Special Gift

When the Muslims took over Makkah, many tribes became Muslim. ‘Amr’s tribe was one of them. His father went to meet the Prophet ﷺ. When he came back, he told everyone, “Muhammad ﷺ is truly a Prophet from Allah!”



The Prophet ﷺ had told him, “When it is time for salah, one of you should give the adhan, and **the one who knows the most Qur’an** should lead salah.”

Everyone looked around. The one who **knew the most Qur’an** was little ‘Amr! Even though he was very young, **they made him the imam.**

‘Amr only had a small cloak. When he went into sajdah, it would slip off. A woman said, “Please cover our imam!” So they bought him a long shirt.

‘Amr was delighted. He said, “**I was so happy with that shirt!** Happier than with anything else!”



‘Amr was very young, but he became the imam because he **loved and memorised the Qur’an!**


Abu Talhah told Anas, "Go to the jars of alcohol and break them." Anas رضي الله عنه broke the jars and got rid of the alcohol.

Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه had a cousin called Mistah رضي الله عنه. Mistah رضي الله عنه was poor, so Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه used to give him money as **charity**.

One day, some people said mean lies about the daughter of Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه. Mistah joined them in saying mean lies too.

Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه felt very upset. "By Allah! I am not going to give Mistah any money again!" he said.



Then, Allah سبحانه وتعالى sent down an ayah in the Qur'an:

(Surah an-Nur:22)

Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه said, “Of course! I would love Allah to forgive me!”

So Abu Bakr رضي الله عنه forgave Mistah and started giving him money again.





A Young Hero With a Big Mission

When the Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم came to Madinah, some Companions came to the him with a young orphan boy named Zayd ibn Thabit رضي الله عنه.

“O Messenger of Allah! This boy has memorised 17 Surahs of the Qur'an!” they said.

Zayd recited the Surahs. The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم was very impressed! He saw that Zayd was very smart and loved the Qur'an.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم told Zayd, “Learn the language of the Jews for me. I don't trust them (to translate or write for me).”



Zayd worked very hard. In just two weeks, he had learned the language of the Jews! Later, he learned other languages too. He became the Prophet's special writer and he would **translate** letters for the Prophet ﷺ.
